

NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

Twenty-seven seniors in Jesuit High School's Class of 2019 were honored as National Merit Semifinalists in the annual prestigious scholarship competition. Additionally, 13 Jesuit seniors were recognized as "Commended" students in the competition.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) underwrites the program which recognizes some 15,000 Semifinalists, who represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors. The NMSC designates Semifinalists on a state representational basis to ensure that outstanding students from across the country are included in the talent pool. The number of Semifinalists named in each state is in proportion to its percentage of the national total of graduating seniors.

Jesuit's 27 National Merit Semifinalists represent 12% of Louisiana's 227 honorees from 54 high schools. The qualifying test score for this year was 217. Scores for Blue Jay Semifinalists ranged from 217 to 226. The scores of "Commended" Blue Jays ranged from 212 to 216.

In the past 13 years, 423 Blue Jays have been honored as National Merit Semifinalists.
