

FACULTY PROFILE

Jesuit boasts a faculty of 120 members, 56 of whom hold advanced degrees, including four who have earned doctorates in their respective fields.

The faculty roster is enriched by six Jesuit priests and scholastics. Among our nine guidance counselors, three are dedicated full-time to college placement.

There is a student-teacher ratio of 12:1, with an average class size of 25.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Jesuit proudly maintains a robust tuition assistance program, generated by the school's endowment. Today, benefactors continue to support Jesuit's endowment through scholarships, enabling the school to maintain an admissions process where financial capability is not a determining factor.

Tuition assistance is based solely on financial need. Jesuit does not award academic, athletic, or other merit-based scholarships or financial awards.

• Families can receive partial or full aid depending on demonstrated need.

- Aid is re-evaluated each year.
- Families can apply for aid in light of new or extenuating circumstances.

Upon their son's acceptance, parents are advised to contact Jesuit's finance office to discuss the procedure for applying for tuition assistance for the coming school year.

NOVEMBER 8, 2023

Archdiocesan application emailed to schools and post on *NOLAdceff.org/secondary-admissions*. Catholic elementary schools will make the Archdiocesan Application Form available to their students directly. On the last line of this application form, identify the 'Selected High School' your child hopes to attend for the 2023-2024 school year. Student may select only ONE high school. Once the form is completed, return it to your son's elementary school which will forward it, along with all of the required records, to Jesuit.

Students of all other elementary schools (public or private) can download the form at *jesuitnola.org/admissions*. Once the form is completed, submit it and the Jesuit Admissions Application along with other required records.

NOVEMBER 10, 2023

Catholic elementary schools collect the application cards from their students. Students of all other schools will submit their application card by Friday, November 10.

NOVEMBER 14, 2023

The Catholic elementary schools will send the application forms and the student records to the 'Selected High School'. Students in non-Catholic elementary schools are required to send application forms and student records by Tuesday, November 14, 2023 directly to the high school of choice.

Student records include: school records to include Cumulative record, any standardized test scores, copies of all report cards (including 1st quarter 7th grade), discipline reports, and attendance records.

JANUARY 13, 2024

Applicants must complete the online Jesuit application prior to testing, as it also serves as registration for the HSPT.

All applicants to Jesuit High School will take the High School Placement Test (HSPT). The \$30.00 one time, non-refundable, non-transferable fee is included with the application fee.

Applicants are expected to arrive at Jesuit High School by 7:30 a.m. The test will begin promptly at 8 a.m. and lasts approximately four hours.

Applicants must also be prepared to submit their most recent report card or first semester grades if they have not done so already. Although all records are taken into consideration, results of testing administered on this day may be used not only to determine high school placement, but also to determine admission.

FEBRUARY 22, 2024

"Dear Blue Jay" letters are mailed to applicants notifying them of their acceptance to jesuit high school. Applicants not accepted to jesuit will also be informed by the school as well as the archdiocese. Applicants declined by Jesuit will receive an "Invitation to Apply" to other high schools in the Archdiocese.

FEBRUARY 23, 2024

Notifications of acceptance are emailed after 3 p.m.
